Should the game be level at 90 minutes it will go straight down to a penalty shoot-out to decide who will be going into the Isthmian League next season.

In September, which seems a life time ago, we led 3-0 here with 25 minutes remaining only to lose 4-3 to a goal in added time.

We then travelled to Gay Dawn at the end of December when the Hoops deservedly won 2-1.

Both clubs would also like to congratulate today's match officials on their appointments to the Final and hope they enjoy their afternoon.

Finally, whoever you are supporting, please get behind them and encourage.

HISTORY - CORINTHIAN FC



Corinthian FC was founded in 1972 by Mr RJ Billings (snr) to provide football in a safe environment, whilst teaching the players the principles that he believed to be important in sport.

The motto was simply “pro omnium beneficio” - for the benefit of all, but on the pitch the principles were simple; “Hard, but fair”. Losing wasn’t considered before the game, but if the result went against them then the players were taught to take it graciously.

For the first ten years of the club’s existence they were pleased to welcome such teams as Tottenham, Charlton and Norwich amongst other league teams as well as county and district representative sides as their opposition. On top of these games there were many regular visitors to Gay Dawn Farm from local clubs making up a fixture list of over 60 games per season.

During the 1980s with the arrival of an experienced football manager, Tony Sitford, they progressed from youth football into men’s football playing in the old Southern League. This level of football by a totally amateur club made them unique, but caused problems in the long run in attracting new players. Into the 1990’s they dropped back down to the Kent League and enjoyed many a season in this set up.

Early into the new century they reviewed the whole structure of their football club and decided that they had lost their roots in youth football and this was having a detrimental effect on their senior side. So, they decided to withdraw temporarily from senior football, whilst they rebuilt the lower levels of the club.

In 2008 they had managed to create a club running five sides, from 13 years old through to 18 years old and it became obvious that they needed to consider the next step in their restructuring. For two seasons they had a liaison with Welling United, integrating

a senior side within Welling United, and developed a reserve side initially playing in Kent Division 2 (season 2008/09) and then moving on (2009/10) into the Suburban League South Division. This partnership has now come to an end.

When the opportunity came for them to re-enter senior football as Corinthian Football Club, they did not hesitate to take it. Probably two years too soon, but the challenge was one they were keen to take. They introduced a second senior side playing in the Suburban League to help them progress their U18’s into men’s football.

The 2010/11 season saw Corinthian FC running two senior sides, one in the Kent Football League Premier Division and one in the Suburban League South Division, plus three youth sides – U14, U15 and U18 in the Kent Youth League. For the 2011/12 season as well as all the above, Corinthian FC had an U18 side in the Ryman Youth League. They feel that that this fills the gap from Kent Youth League to senior football, enabling them to offer a true progression for all their players. The 2012/13, 14/15, 15/16, 17/18, 18/19 and 19/20 seasons saw the addition of U13 and U15 teams playing in the Kent Youth League.

After untimely ends to the 2019/20 & 2020/21 season Corinthian Football Club were delighted to have been promoted into the Isthmian League Division 1 South East for the 2021/22 season, where they finished 8th in their first season.

After two seasons in the Isthmian East Division, Corinthian returned to the SCEFL for the 2023/24 season, renewing old friendships.

Having lost to Erith Town on penalties in the SCEFL Challenge Cup Final, they will be delighted to meet them again this afternoon for a chance to return to the Isthmian League.

PLAYER PROFILES - CORINTHIAN

Nathan Boamah - Goalkeeper

Young goalkeeper enjoying his first full season in men's football. Produced a man of the match performance in the second leg of the semi final to help secure a place in today's final.

Jamie Billings - Defender

Club captain who has recently surpassed 400 first team games for the club. Wears his heart on his sleeve and has won the Player of the Month award on three separate occasions this season.

Sam Fitzgerald - Defender

Joined the club half way through last season and has proved himself a good addition. A good talker on the pitch and happy to give advice and guidance to the younger players in the squad. Has popped up with crucial goals this season.

Tom Fitzgerald - Defender

Re-joined the club just after the start of the season, after last playing in the 2013/2014 season. Tom has added good quality and composure to the back line and reads the game incredibly well.

Ryan Cheek - Defender

No nonsense defender that signed for the club part way through the season from Snodland Town. Ryan has consistently produced high level performances and leads the back line very well.

Kamron Holmes-Lewis - Defender

A young defender that has unfortunately had his season disrupted with injuries. Has a level of maturity on the pitch way beyond his tender age and has the ability to comfortably pass the ball out from the back to start attacks. Has the potential to go a long way in the game.

Harry Lashley - Defender

Injuries have unfortunately stopped Harry from a regular run of games over the course of the season, but when he has played, has proved himself to be a solid player at this level. Has played at both full back and centre back this season.

Dean Nayler - Defender

Tough tackling defender who has cemented his place in the side with a run of strong performances. Deano is equally adept at playing full back or as a central defender. Good in the air and strong in the tackle. A firm favourite amongst players and supporters alike. Scored the second goal in the play-off semi-final at Faversham, his first since the opening day of the season.

Jack Billings - Defender

Jack has battled back from a couple of long term knee injuries and has made a massive impact since his return. Scorer of good goals and classes himself as a maverick on the pitch.

Jack Unwin - Defender

Another in his second season at the club, having joined last season from Bowers and Pitsea. Jack is a full back that loves to get forward and provides good quality on the ball from deep positions. A regular at the start of the season, has found starts more limited recently, but still a crucial part of the squad.

Cameron Beckles - Defender

One of the best one vs one defenders I have seen at this level and another that is equally capable of playing at full back or in central defence. Had to be patient for his chance at the start of the season, but took his chance and quickly established himself as a key part of the squad.

Ahmed Salim Futa - Midfielder

A contender for the nicest person in football. 'Sally' as he is affectionately known is in his second season at the club and won the Management Teams Player of the Year last year. Marauding midfielder, who has a lovely left foot. A great player on the pitch and an even better person off it.

Brandon Davey - Midfielder

Box to box midfielder who covers every blade of grass on the pitch. Struggled with a niggly injury in the early part of the season, but over the past couple of seasons has proved himself to be a key part of the team. Has never won a Thursday night 5-a-side competition.

Conor Driscoll - Midfielder

Another that joined part way through the season after previously taking time away from football. Conor is a cultured midfielder that has a knack of popping up in the box and scoring goals.

Sam Bewick - Midfielder

Sam is in his second spell at the club and is closing in on both 100 first team appearances and also 50 first team goals. Has played in pretty much every position this season, showing his versatility and value to the squad.

Oscar Housego - Midfielder

Rejoined the club after a short spell away at Step 4 at the start of the season. Oscar has played nearly 350 first team matches for the club and provides both energy and quality in the middle of the pitch. Has just under 30 goal contributions this season since his return.

Corey Holden - Midfielder

Talented midfielder that has recently broken into the first team picture following a strong season with the Under 18s. Causes problems for opposition defences with his

forward runs and ability to skip passed players.

Luke Adams - Forward

Rejoined the club after a short stint at Rusthall earlier in the season, a player who has fantastic ability on the ball and excellent hold up play. Works tirelessly for the team.

Michael Hagan - Forward

Second spell at the club and quickly settled in and now enjoying his football again, which has always been key to getting the best out of Michael. A player for the big games and adds pace and quality to the front line. Very close to 150 first team appearances for the club.

Ross Obazee - Forward

Picked up a bad knee injury earlier in the season away at Tunbridge Wells. A great character to have around the squad and is working hard on his rehab to hopefully return before the end of the season.

Charlie Clover - Forward

Charlie is having a fantastic season, closing in on 20 goals and nearly as many assists this season. A real fox in the box type player, who has a natural act of being in the right place at the right time to score goals.

Michael Ihiedi - Forward

Another Under 18 that has come into the side and made a positive impact. Has pace to burn and a constant threat with his powerful runs and willingness to take defenders on. Definitely one for the future.

Festos Kamara - Forward

Joined the club last season before leaving for Tunbridge Wells. Rejoined earlier this season and is another player that causes problems with his pace and ability to stretch opposition defences.

ERITH TOWN FC - HISTORY

Formed in 1956 as Woolwich Town, the Dockers attained senior status in 1995-96 upon reaching the London Spartan League Premier Division in 1995-96.

By then the club had already changed their name to Erith Town, reflecting a move to Erith Stadium.

After one year in the Spartan Premier, the Dockers successfully applied to cross the Pyramid to the Kent League.

After struggling in the lower reaches of the League for three seasons, the Dockers celebrated the new Millennium with a then best seventh place in 1999-2000 and reached the London Senior Cup Final, losing 5-1 to Bedfont.

In the following seven seasons Erith only once reached such heights again, finishing seventh in 2003-4.

The appointment of former Fisher Athletic player Mark Tompkins as player-manager midway through 2006-7 saw an upturn in fortunes and the following season he led the team to fifth in the Kent League. He also brought the club their first silverware as a senior club as record appearance maker Alan Hanlon lifted the Kent League Cup after a 1-0 win over much-fancied Hythe Town in the Final at Folkestone.

Tommo's departure on the eve of 2008-9 led to the appointment of Steve O'Boyle who took the Dockers back to the Kent League Cup Final for a second season. Despite drawing 1-1 after extra time against Croydon, the Dockers went down 3-1 on penalties.

Tony Russell took over the reins when O'Boyle departed in October 2010 guiding the club to a third successive mid table finish but bringing the Kent Senior Trophy to the club after a 3-1 win over Tunbridge Wells in the Final.

Having achieved a new best of fourth the following season, Russell departed for neighbours VCD Athletic with Erith Town top

of the League in November 2012 and after a brief spell with James Collins in charge, Tompkins returned to take the Dockers to new personal best of third spot.

Tommo repeated the feat in 2013-14 before departing and a turbulent 2014-15 saw three managers and a Houdini style escape from relegation under Martin and Joe Ford.

Two further seasons of struggle followed before Mark Deveney took over the club in the Summer of 2017, immediately appointing former owner Albert Putnam as President for his work as player, manager and Chairman in over 50 years with the club.

On the 26th August the club took part in the last ever game at Brentford's Griffin Park ground, losing 6-3 to the Bees' B team in the London Senior Cup semi-final.

After a fourth placed finish in 2022-23, their best for ten years, the Dockers have moved to share with Sporting Club Thamesmead at Bayliss Avenue as they bid to progress on and off the field.

With this in mind the Dockers appointed Kay Deveney as their first female Chair in the Summer of 2023, with Mark Deveney continuing as CEO.

The 2023-24 season has been a memorable one for the club as we lifted two trophies.

The SCEFL Challenge Cup was lifted after a penalties win over Corinthian as the teams drew 1-1 at Hollands & Blair FC.

The team followed that up as they twice came from behind to beat Croydon 3-2 at Maidstone United to win the Kent Senior Trophy.

A strong finish to the season, and a 2-1 semi-final win at Glebe, has set up a place in today's play-off Final and the chance to play Isthmian League football for the first time.

PLAYER PROFILES - ERITH TOWN

Mackenzie Foley (Goalkeeper)

Mackenzie joined the Dockers in the Summer of 2022 after spells at Tooting & Mitcham United and Sutton Common Rovers. Broke the club's clean sheet record in his first season. Recently made his 100th appearance.

Tom Ash (Defender)

A product of the club's successful academy, Tom has made over 100 first team appearances while still in his teens. Can play in the centre of defence or as a full-back. Scored the equalising goal at Glebe in the semi-final

Ryan Mahal (Defender)

Ryan joined the Dockers from Welling Town at the start of 2020-21. A huge influence within the squad and current captain, Ryan is also a useful goalkeeper and played the second half between the posts in a 4-3 win at Faversham Town in November.

Jerome Jayaguru (Defender)

A product of the Maidstone United youth system, Jerome joined the Dockers at the start of last season after impressing in pre-season. Has also recently made his 100th appearance.

Ted Green (Defender)

Joined the Dockers mid-season and has played thirteen times, including a substitute appearance for the second half of the Kent Senior Trophy Final. Excellent dead ball delivery.

Jack Holland (Defender)

Joined Erith Town in the summer having previously played for Corinthian. Scored his first Dockers goal in spectacular fashion in an FA Cup replay against

Hassocks. After a long spell out of the side 'Jacko' has returned to play in two Cup Final wins.

Ladic Melconian (Midfield)

Ukrainian Ladic joined from Bridon Ropes, where he scored 37 goals in 2021-22, after impressing in trial appearances at the start of last season. Hard-working midfielder who is a popular member of the squad. Made his 100th appearance in the last League game of the season.

James Miles (Midfield)

'Milo' made his Dockers debut in January 2022, and passed the 100 appearance mark for the Dockers this season. Scored the winning penalty in the League Cup shoot-out against Corinthian.

George Goodwin (Midfield)

Signed from Beckenham Town in November, George is a calming influence on the team and can also fill in at centre-back. Scored on his debut in a 4-3 win at Faversham Town.

Jamie Miller (Midfield)

Signed from Rusthall at the start of the season, Jamie does a lot of vital work in midfield, that allows the team to play. One of our quieter squad members, but you always notice when he's not playing.

James Dyer (Midfield / Forward)

James has made massive strides since coming to Erith Town at the start of the campaign. Has scored over 30 goals this season including two in the Kent Senior Trophy against Croydon and the penalty equaliser in the Challenge Cup Final against Corinthian.

Harry Taylor (Forward)

Came to the club's attention after scoring 57 goals as Red Velvet won the Kent County League two seasons ago. His first campaign was blighted by injuries but he has thrived from enjoying full fitness and scored 34 goals this season, including the winner in the play-off semi-final at Glebe. Team joker.

Ollie Milton (Forward)

Rejoined the club at the start of the season, having made a few appearances at the start of his career. Ollie has a fantastic work-rate and has scored 20 goals this season.

Jake Lovell (Forward)

Signed from Greenways in September where he led the goalscoring charts in Division One. Took some time to get his first goal, but is now starting to fulfil his undoubted potential and finding the net regularly.

Aaron Jeffrey (Midfield)

Previously a striker, Aaron is in his fourth spell with the Dockers and brings vast experience to the squad. Recently made his 100th appearance.

Harrison Carnegie (Winger)

Well known on the SCEFL and Isthmian League circuit, Harrison recently signed for the Dockers from Phoenix Sports. A handful for any defender and delivers a great cross.

Omotunmise Akanni (Winger)

Recently joined the Dockers from Bearsted and simply known as 'T' at Bayliss Avenue. Has only made a handful of appearances but shows great potential.

Bradley Ryan (Winger)

Talented young winger who came through Welling United's youth system. Has assisted in vital goals in the Kent Senior Trophy final and play-off semi-final.

Louie Clarke (Forward)

Having signed from Rusthall and scored five times in two friendlies in pre-season, Louie suffered an ACL injury that has seen him yet to make his competitive debut. Has worked hard to return ahead of schedule and be a part of the squad. Came off the bench to make his first competitive appearance in the final League game at home to Snodland Town.

Calum McGeehan (Midfield)

A recent signing after spell out with injury, Calum has Isthmian League experience at Herne Bay and Horsham. Has twice come off the bench and scored with his first touch in his short spell at Bayliss Avenue.

Tom Walters (Defender)

Tom was a part of the Dockers' Kent Youth League winning side last season. Has spent some time getting match-time at FC Elmstead but has impressed enough to be recalled to the squad.

Tommy Taylor (Goalkeeper)
